








Danger Level 1 - Low



Tendency: Constant avalanche danger \longrightarrow on Tuesday 09 03 2021

The avalanche conditions are mostly favourable.

Avalanches can be released in deep layers in particular at transitions from a shallow to a deep snowpack. Caution is to be exercised in particular on extremely steep shady slopes above approximately 2200 m. Slight increase in danger of moist and wet avalanches as a consequence of warming during the day and solar radiation, in particular on steep sunny slopes and below approximately 2400 m.

Snowpack

The snowpack will be stable over a wide area. The surface of the snowpack has frozen to form a strong crust and will hardly soften at all. In steep terrain there is a danger of falling on the hard snow surface. Isolated avalanche prone weak layers exist in the old snowpack. This applies on shady slopes above approximately 2200 m.

Tendency

The avalanche danger will persist.
