

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## **Danger Level 1 - Low**





Tendency: Constant avalanche danger on Friday 12 03 2021

## The avalanche danger after a clear night will be low (level 1).

Avalanches can in very isolated cases be released by large loads, in particular at transitions from a shallow to a deep snowpack. At high altitudes and in high Alpine regions these avalanche prone locations are a little more prevalent.

Slight increase in danger of moist and wet avalanches as a consequence of warming.

## Snowpack

Significant warming above approximately 2000 m. The snowpack will be stable over a wide area. Outgoing longwave radiation during the night will be quite good. The surface of the snowpack will freeze to form a strong crust. In steep terrain there is a danger of falling on the hard snow surface. Isolated avalanche prone weak layers exist in the old snowpack.

## Tendency

The avalanche danger will persist.
