





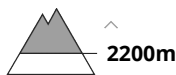
## Danger Level 2 - Moderate



**Tendency: Constant avalanche danger** →  
on Saturday 04 03 2023



Persistent  
weak layer



Snowpack stability: **poor**

Frequency: **few**

Avalanche size: **large**

Moderate avalanche danger will be encountered over a wide area. Weakly bonded old snow requires caution.

In some places avalanches can be released in the old snowpack and reach dangerously large size. The prevalence of the avalanche prone locations will increase with altitude. They are difficult to recognise. Isolated whumping sounds can indicate the danger. In addition the somewhat older wind slabs are capable of being triggered in some cases still. Backcountry touring and other off-piste activities call for defensive route selection.



## Danger Level 1 - Low

Individual avalanche prone locations are to be found in particular in extremely steep terrain. Even a small avalanche can sweep people along and give rise to falls.
